Our Opponents

A look at the Galaxy's early-season opposition

March 27 - New England Revolution ... For the second time in five years, the Galaxy open their season



with a home game against the New England Revolution. LA swept the season series from the Revolution in 2009, winning 1-0 at The Home Depot Center on July 4 and then

winning 2-1 at Gillette Stadium just over a month later. Landon Donovan opened the scoring in that game with a goal that would go on to be named the MLS Goal of the Year. Many of the familiar faces that have led the Revolution to continued success in MLS over the past decade have now moved on, but head coach Steve Nicol is back, meaning that Bruce Arena and Co. are sure to have a battle on their hands.

Key Player: Preston Burpo - With former Galaxy goalkeeper Matt Reis scheduled to miss the start of the season through injury, Burpo, acquired from Colorado in January, will have to man the goals for New England and stake his claim as the club's No.1.

April 1 - Chivas USA ... The first installment of the SuperClasico comes early as the Galaxy host



Chivas USA in the second game of the season for both clubs. The Galaxy went 2-0-1 against their rivals in the regular season last year and then knocked them out of the playoffs with a 3-2 aggregate goal win in their Western Conference Semifinal Series.

This year's Galaxy team will look to continue their strong run against Chivas USA, having won the first meeting of the year between the two sides four times in five years since the rivalry began.

Key Player: Osael Romero - The young Salvadoran playmaker joined Chivas USA and will look to have an immediate impact in his first SuperClasico. Compared by some to Galaxy legend Mauricio Cienfuegos, Romero is dangerous with the ball at his feet anywhere on the field, but especially so in the final third.

April 17 - Real Salt Lake ... A rematch of MLS Cup 2009, the Galaxy will look to exact some revenge on the league's reigning champion. Both teams bring back most of the key components from that historic battle, meaning that this game should be another



tense affair. There may not be the MLS Cup on the line this time, but that won't make Bruce Arena's squad any less likely to want to win. Additionally, LA will be looking to snap a three-game home winless streak that dates back to June

2007. Since that game, the Galaxy are 0-2-1 at home against RSL, including a 2-0 loss last June that snapped the Galaxy's 10-game unbeaten streak.

Key Player: Robbie Findley - One of the fastest forwards in the league, Findley will be looking to stake his claim on Bob Bradley's World Cup roster with a strong showing in the first month of the MLS season. The former Galaxy forward scored RSL's only goal in MLS Cup to force the game to the deciding penalty shootout and also scored the first time the two teams played in the regular season, a 2-2 draw at Rio Tinto Stadium.

May 1 - Philadelphia Union ... The latest expansion team in MLS, the Union open the month of May with a visit to The Home Depot Center. Led by head



coach Peter Nowak, the Union come into their inaugural season with high hopes thanks to success in the expansion draft and the SuperDraft. They will be looking to continue the trend of

Seattle, who won in their first-ever road trip to face LA. Former Galaxy players like Danny Califf, Stefani Miglioranzi and Alejandro Moreno highlight a roster that also included the likes of Fred, Michael Orozco.

Key Player: Danny Mwanga - The No. 1 overall pick in the 2010 MLS SuperDraft, a lot is expected of Mwanga. A standout at Oregon State, the 20year-old forward has the pace and finishing ability to trouble opposing defenders all game long.


Look back and ahead with the Galaxy left back

two-time MLS Cup winner, Todd Dunivant rejoined the Galaxy in February 2009 and immediately helped to improve what had been the worst defense in MLS. One of the top left backs in MLS, Dunivant helped the Galaxy cut their goals allowed total in half from 62 in 2008 to just 31 in 2009 and to keep a club record 12 regular season clean sheets.

We caught up with Todd to discuss his return to the Galaxy in 2009 and what he is looking to accomplish with the club here in 2010...

How excited were you to be returning to Los Angeles in 2009?

"It was great for me to come back to LA. This was a place that was dear to my heart. I won an MLS



Cup here in 2005, so coming back was great. It offered me a second chance at an opportunity like this and I was ready to take advantage of it."

More importantly, how important was it to finally be healthy?

"It was huge. Any time you have an injury that keeps you out for eight full months, it's difficult to come back and it takes a lot of time. You have to put a lot of hard work in and the trainers did a great job of getting me back on the field. From that point, I was able to play my way through the rest of the season."

Was the injury in the back of your mind at all last

year? Is it still?

"Last year my ankle was pretty sore, I could play and get through a game, but after the game I would be limping pretty noticeably. Then, the last third of the season I got over the hump and I began to feel a lot better. I've now carried that into this season and it's not even something that I'm even thinking about, so that's a credit to Armando, Shunta, Ceci (the club's training staff) and everyone who has worked on it."

Given the injury, were you surprised at how well you were able to play last year?

"No, not really. It was a good start and I want to be able to build on it. But I think that is the belief

of our whole team. Yes we the won Western Conference, had a good season and have begun to turn the club back around to where it should be. But at the same time. we ended the year with a pretty bitter taste in our mouth's, so hopefully that will make us that much hungrier and push for a championship this year."


The team began to hit its stride when the back four of A.J., Omar, Gregg and yourself in front of Donovan began to get comfortable. How important is consistency to a defensive unit?

"It's key. When you have the same guys week in and week out, it really helps. And this year, it's the first time that this club has had this type of consistency across the board in a long time. And that is going to go along way."

"You could see it in the preseason, just the familiarity that you have with the rest of the team, you don't need to start over. When you are turning your roster over year after year,

you become an expansion team in a way and you have a lot of work to do. That's not to say that we don't have a lot of work to do, we're just starting that much further ahead. We've seen the successful teams in this league stay together and have a level of consistency in their rosters."

What are some of your goals for the 2010 season?



can improve on the offensive side in 2010.

"For me it's to continue to stay healthy and try to help and solidify our back line. Last year our defense was a key in turning things around from 2008 and I thought that we did a very good job of that. This year, we're also looking to be a better possession team and a better attacking team, and that is something myself, A.J. and Sean can really help out with; getting forward in the attack and hopefully creating some good goalscoring opportunities when we can keep the ball."

he 15th season of Major League Soccer will see a champion defending its first-ever trophy in Real Salt Lake, the League's 16th and newest team in Philadelphia Union, and two new majestic homes for the Beautiful Game

 Red Bull Arena in Harrison, N.J. and PPL Park in Chester, Pa. In this World Cup year, there will be no shortage of excitement on these shores as well. Here's a team-by-team guide to bring you up to speed for the 2010 MLS campaign.

New team and old rivalries heat up the season outlook

















Chicago Fire

New coach and key additions look to help Fire take the next step

2009 Record: 11-7-12, 45 pts., 2nd in Eastern Conference

GF: 39 (tied for 6th in MLS) GA: 34 (tied for 6th in MLS)

Finish: Defeated New England Revolution in Conference Semifinal (3-2 on aggregate); Lost to Real

Salt Lake in Conference Championship (5-4 on penalty kicks)

Head Coach: Carlos de los Cobos (first season)

FOR THE FOURTH TIME IN THE PAST five Major League Soccer seasons, the Chicago Fire fell a game short of the MLS Cup Final, this time falling on penalty kicks to Real Salt Lake on their Toyota Park home field in the Eastern Conference Championship. Former El Salvador national team coach Carlos de los Cobos takes over as head

coach, replacing Denis Hamlett. The Fire will have some attacking holes to fill with Chris Rolfe (6 goals) and Cuauhtémoc Blanco (5 goals, 8 assists) having both left the club. El Salvador national teamer Julio Martinez has been brought in to guide the attack, while Polish international Krzysztof Krol comes into the defense.

Columbus Crew

Crew looks for Cup experience to lead it through MLS campaign

2009 Record: 13-7-10, 49 pts., 1st in Eastern Conference

GF: 41 (5th in MLS) · GA: 31 (3rd in MLS)

Finish: Lost to Real Salt Lake (4-2 on aggregate) in Conference Semifinal.

Head Coach: Robert Warzycha (second year as head coach)

DESPITE WINNING THE SUPPORTERS' SHIELD for the second consecutive season, the Crew saw their bid to repeat as MLS Cup champions ended on home turf by Real Salt Lake. A year after leading the league with 19 assists, Guillermo Barros Schelotto finished tied for third with 12 goals. The Argentinean

will be looking to develop a partnership with Colombian international Sergio Herrera, who was acquired from Deportivo Cali to lead the Crew attack. Columbus will start their season ahead of every other team, the only MLS club to qualify for the CONCACAF Champions League quarterfinals.

D.C. United

Onalfo takes the reins with an eye on blending newcomers with veterans

2009 Record: 9-8-13, 40 pts., 4th in Eastern Conference GF: 43 (tied for 2nd in MLS) · GA: 44 (11th in MLS)

Finish: Did not reach MLS Cup Playoffs · Head Coach: Curt Onalfo (first year with club)

AFTER FAILING TO REACH THE POSTSEASON for the second time in as many seasons, Curt Onalfo has moved from the Kansas City Wizards to take charge of United, replacing Tom Soehn. Last year's leading scorer for United - 2007 MLS MVP Luciano Emilio (10 goals) - has moved on, but United will again be counting on Jaime Moreno (9 goals, 3 assists), the league's last surviving Original. Chris Pontius is

coming off a standout rookie year (4 goals, 3 assists), while United have also signed Australian international Danny Allsopp and Salvadoran playmaker Christian Castillo to bolster the attack.



Kansas City Wizards

Consistent play is key to club's success in 2010

2009 Record: 8-13-9, 33 pts., 6th in Eastern Conference GF: 33 (tied for 13th in MLS) - GA: 42 (tied for 10th in MLS)

Finish: Did not reach MLS Cup Playoffs · Head Coach: Peter Vermes (second year with club)

AFTER TAKING OVER AS HEAD COACH IN A LATE bid



to save a playoff spot. Peter Vermes has set about remaking Wizards over the winter. Gone are Argentinean playmaker Claudio Lopez (7 goals, 8

assists), 13-year veteran goalkeeper Kevin Hartman (MLS all-time wins leader) and Mexican-American Herculez Gomez. Signed to guide the attack from midfield is Stéphane Auvray of Guadeloupe, while Colombian center back Pablo Escobar should provide steel to the back line and Jimmy Nielsen has come from Denmark to man the goal. Josh Wolff will be looked to for the goals after scoring a careerbest 11 in 2009, along with Davy Arnaud (5 goals, 2 assists).

NE Revolution

Healthy in 2010, Revs look to regain their MLS Cup Playoff form

2009 Record: 11-10-9, 42 pts., 3rd in Eastern Conference

GF: 33 (tied for 13th in MLS) · GA: 37 (8th in MLS) · Finish: Lost to Chicago Fire in Conference Semifinal (3-2 on aggregate) · Head Coach: Steve Nicol (ninth season with club)

THE NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION SUFFERED through a difficult, injury-plagued campaign - and still nearly reached the Eastern Conference Championship yet again. Still, league head coaching dean Steve Nicol will direct a new-look club in 2010. MLS Original Steve Ralston has moved on, joining Division II AC St. Louis as a player-coach.

Hard-working midfielder Jeff Larentowicz, along with Wells Thompson, went to Colorado for center back Cory Gibbs and goalkeeper Preston Burpo - key with Matt Reis sidelined after knee surgery. Taylor Twellman will be looking to rebound from a concussion-marred season that saw him limited to just two games (though he scored two goals).

New York Red Bulls New coach and stadium give Red Bulls reason to believe

2009 Record: 5-19-6, 21 pts., 7th in Eastern Conference GF: 27 (15th in MLS) · GA: 47 (tied for 13th in MLS)

Finish: Did not reach MLS Cup Playoffs · Head Coach: Hans Backe (first season with club)

THE NEW YORK RED BULLS FINISHED 2008 with an appearance in the MLS Cup Final, but followed that with a disastrous season that included a three-month winless streak. With the club set to open the majestic Red Bull Arena this season, it has turned to Hans Backe, who won four Danish

league titles with Copenhagen and Aalborg, to take the head coaching reins. Juan Pablo Angel will be back after hitting double digits in goals (12) for a third MLS season. Costa Rican international defender Roy Miller has been brought in to stiffen the back line.

Philadelphia Union MLS Cup Playoffs are the goal in club's inaugural season

2009 Record: Expansion team · Head Coach: Peter Nowak

THE LEAGUE'S NEWEST CLUB BELIEVES a playoff spot is within reach. Former D.C. United boss Peter Nowak has built a club of solid MLS veterans, led by striker Alejandro Moreno (4 goals with Columbus in 2009), midfielder Fred (2 goals, 4 assists at D.C. United) and defender Shavar Thomas (ex-Chivas

USA). Defender Dan Califf has returned to the league, while No. 1 overall pick Danny Mwanga and U.S. U-17 national teamer Jack McInerney could figure immediately. While Union will start the season at Lincoln Financial Field, PPL Park on the Chester, Pa. waterfront will open in June.

Toronto FC

Preki takes the helm with goal of bringing MLS Cup to Canada

2009 Record: 10-11-9, 39 pts., 5th in Eastern Conference

GF: 37 (9th in MLS) · GA: 46 (12th in MLS)

Finish: Did not make MLS Cup Playoffs. - Head Coach: Preki (first season with club)

FOLLOWING A THIRD SEASON IN CLUB history that ended short of the MLS Cup Playoffs, Toronto FC has turned to Preki to finally bring postseason soccer to BMO Field. In his first season in his hometown, Dwayne De Rosario led TFC with 11 goals and 6 assists. He'll look to combine with Chad Barrett (5

goals, 3 assists) to lead the Reds' attack. Honduras international Amado Guevara has moved on after a 5-goal, 6-assist season while fan favorite Danny Dichio retired, but Toronto will look to a full season from Canadian international Ali Gerba and picked up pacey winger Jacob Peterson from Colorado.

Center rivals LA Galaxy. In the wake of that result, Preki moved to Toronto FC as head coach, replaced by ex-U.S. international Martín Vásquez. With World Cup berths on the line, Chivas will be looking to midfielder Sacha Kljestan (5 goals, 3 assists) and defender Jonathan Bornstein, though some playmaking responsibility will be taken by El Salvador international Osael Romero. Goalkeeper Zach Thornton will return after a remarkable Best XI season at age 35.

Colorado Rapids


Trades and transfers will join Conor Casey to leads Rapids this season





Galaxy forward is looking ahead to 2010 season

he Galaxy's co-team-leader with six assists last season. Mike Magee enjoyed a productive first season with the Galaxy in 2009. The 25-year-old Chicago native also added two goals in the regular season before scoring twice in the postseason, including the Galaxy's only goal at MLS Cup.

Was it odd or strange leaving New York after six years with the club?

"I would say that it was more of a relief. When you are in one spot for so long you learn how to cut corners and do certain things that are unhealthy for you and not good for your career. So this was a good move for me."



Did it help coming into a team with so many new players?

"It did. There weren't a lot of guys brought back from the year before so we all had to grow together. It also helped that I had played with a lot of these guys in the past and I had played for Bruce before, so knowing him and his family was a big help as well."

You played on both wings and up front last season, are you more comfortable in one over the other?

"No, I'm actually pretty comfortable anywhere really. I think that I can play on the left, the right or in the middle so I don't really worry about it. As long as I'm on the field and can help the team I'm happy."

What are your goals for this season?

"From a team standpoint, I think that last year, to get a glimpse of MLS Cup and how close we came. only to fall just short was a pretty big disappointment. This will be my eighth year in the league and I've played in two Finals but I haven't won one yet, so I definitely want to get an MLS Cup."

You grew up in Chicago and have lived on both coasts. Which do you prefer?

"First of all, out here is kind of surreal I live in Manhattan Beach and it's not real life. You watch these people and see the way that they live and it's incredible. You can't knock this at all, but I think that I have to say Chicago. That's where I'm from and all my family is there".


We caught up with him at training to talk soccer and to find out how he is enjoying his time with the Galaxy Youth Academy.

Talk about your experience so far with the Galaxy **Youth Academy:**

"It's been great. The training that the coaches put us through is really good and nothing like I've ever had before. The facilities are incredible, the equipment is great and everything is run very professionally. I love it and don't want to be anywhere else."

How would you describe the level of coaching that you are receiving?

"The training level is really high and the expectations from the coaches are high. They try to make it as professional as they can and mock what the first

team is doing and I that's what I like about it. Everything is done professionally, so we have to be serious about our training and I've improved a lot because of it."

He's helped me with every facet of the game, shot-stopping, decision making and the technical work that goes into being a professional keeper. He's a really good mentor and I enjoy training with him."

Do you watch Galaxy goalkeeper Donovan Ricketts and Josh Saunders to try and pick up any pointers that you could then improve on?

"I enjoy watching what those guys are doing in games and seeing what they are doing technically and then try to bring that into my game. They're both really good goalkeepers."

How do you think your game has improved since joining the Galaxy Academy?

"Just through the constant training and the professional level of it, I've been able to improve technically, physically and also my confidence has gotten a lot higher. Playing with older players in the Academy has helped my game a lot."

Best in Training ... Dema Kovalenko because he is the most entertaining out on the field.



Did You Know?

Facts about the LA Galaxy

- * The Galaxy's appearance in the 2009 MLS Cup Playoffs was the 11th time that the club had reached the postseason, tying the league record for the most in league history.
- * At the end of the 2009 season, 16 of the 26 players on the Galaxy roster were not with the club at the end of the 2008 campaign. This season, 20 of the 25 players on the squad were with the team in 2009.
- * In 2009, Landon Donovan became just the second Galaxy player ever to win the MLS MVP award. He joined Carlos Ruiz who claimed the prize during the 2002 campaign when he scored a club record 24 goals and an MLS record eight postseason goals to lead LA to their first-ever MLS Cup.
- * The Galaxy set a club record with 12 clean sheets in 2009. Donovan Ricketts had nine of the 12 while Josh Saunders added two. The pair then combined for one on August 19 at Chicago, with Ricketts playing the opening 85 minutes without allowing a goal before going off injured. He was replaced by Saunders who managed to complete the shutout as LA won 2-0. Ricketts added two more shutouts in the postseason.
- * Omar Gonzalez was named the MLS Rookie of the Year in 2009, joining Sean Franklin (2008) as the only two Galaxy players to have ever won the award. Additionally, it was just the third time that players from the same team won the award in consecutive seasons.
- * For the second straight season, Alan Gordon enters the year as the Galaxy's longest-tenured player, having been with the club since 2004. Gordon, who has 15 career goals, joins Landon Donovan as the only two players to have remained with the club since their MLS Cup championship in



2005. Todd Dunivant was also on that team, but he had stops in New York and Toronto before returning to LA last season.

- * The club re-acquired midfielder Clint Mathis during the offseason in a trade with Real Salt Lake. This is Mathis' third stint with the Galaxy.
- * This is a World Cup year and Galaxy stars David Beckham and Landon Donovan are each expected to represent their countries at this summer's tournament in South Africa. If both do make their team's final squads, it would be a third World Cup for Donovan and a fourth World Cup for Beckham.
- * In addition to Beckham and Donovan, Chris Birchall (2006 with Trinidad and Tobago), Eddie Lewis (2002 and 2006 with the U.S.), Clint Mathis (2002 with the U.S.) and Donovan Ricketts (1998 with Jamaica) have been at the World Cup, as have Galaxy coaches Bruce Arena (as a coach in 2002 and 2006), Dave Sarachan (as a coach in 2002) and Cobi Jones (as a player in 1994, 1998 and 2002).
